






Publisher's View

First of all I want to wish legendary trumpeter

and flugelhornist, Sam Noto a very Happy Birthday, Sam will be 94 on April 17th this year. Way back on May 14th 1956, I was home on leave from the British Army. To my delight the superb 20 piece band of Stan Kenton was appearing at the Savoy Ballroom Southsea, Portsmouth, England. The place was sold out, both dancers



and listners attended the event. Not only was it packed but filled with cigarette smoke, it seemed everybody smoked back then. Kenton's band had a powerfull, very brassy sound. Always had s superb horn section, at that time I had no idea Sam Noto was in it. Not until 1970 when I was chatting to Sam at the Bourbon St. jazz club here in Toronto. He got quite a kick out of it when he knew I was there at that time. Sam has performed with about every big band you can think of. Count Basie, Woody Herman, Louis Bellson, and our own Boss Brass. Sam was regularly in our city from his home town



Buffalo, often with another great bebop player, saxophonist Don Menza. Menza will be 88 this year. One exceptional quintet recording given to me by the late superb saxophonist and good friend, Eugene Amaro. Title of this C.D. LIVE EVERYWHERE - Eugene Amaro. Featured were, Sam Noto, trumpet, Bernie Senensky, piano,

Dave Young, bass, Jerry Fuller, drums, and, Eugene saxophones. I believe this recording was done at the Ontario Science centre, when they had regular jazz concerts. Just another reminder when this city was second to none for jazz. Dave Milbourne - Publisher.

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
